Who am I?	
Literacy	<p>Creating their own 'Me' book all about themselves. Beginning to self-register themselves by using their own photo or name. Listening to new daily stories.</p>
Class Books	<p>Owl Babies. How do Dinosaurs go to School? All about Alfie. Pip and Posy and the New Friend. And Tango makes Three. Farmer Duck</p>
Reading	<p>Learning about sounds from phrase 1 phonics. Listening to stories individually with an adult.</p>
Mathematics	<p>Using number language while playing. Building models using different construction sets. Learning the days of the week song and talking about the different types of weather.</p>
Understanding the World	<p>Talking about their likes and dislikes. Learning to name their body parts. Going on an Autumn walk.</p>
Art	<p>Trying out a range of new tools and techniques. Creating self and family portraits linked to famous artists.</p>
PE	<p>Learning how to climb safely while outside. Joining in with a variety of ring games.</p>
Music	<p>Joining in with Nursery Rhymes. Learning number songs. Singing along with the guitar.</p>
Computing	<p>DB Primary: Using paint to create pictures.</p>
PSHE	<p>Regulating our Emotions. Learning to adapt to a new learning environment.</p>

Talk to your child about their appearance. What colour is their hair? Is it long or short? What colour are their eyes?




Talk about what your child could do when they were a baby and what they can do now that they are growing up.




How many owls are in the story?

Pip and Posy and the New Friend




Where did Pip and Posy go?
