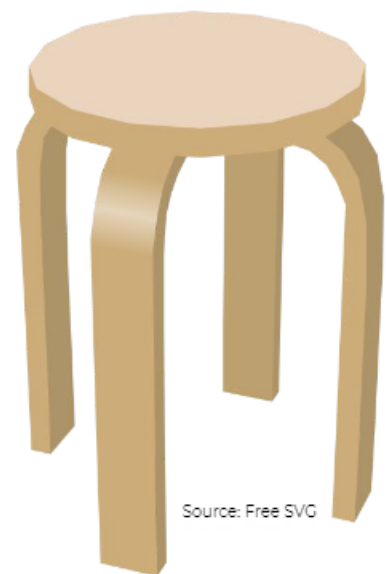

Writing



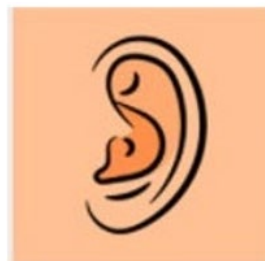
Today we are going to continue writing using descriptive language.

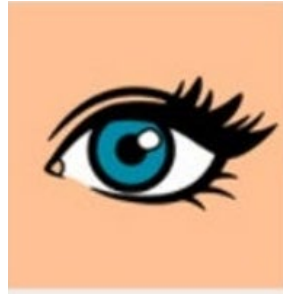

Bicycles Throughout Time

After the first bicycle (the Draisine or 'Hobby Horse') the next bicycle was invented in 1830.



**Draisine or
'Hobby Horse'**



**Velocipede or
'Bone Shaker'**

It was called the **Velocipede** or 'Bone Shaker' because it was so uncomfortable!

It was the first bicycle with pedals.

The high wheel bicycle or '**Penny Farthing**' was invented in 1870. It was popular as its large front wheel made it go very fast. However they were dangerous as you sat very high up and it was a big drop to the ground! There were lots of accidents.

Safety Bicycle

The Rover safety bicycle was made during the 1880s. It was much safer than the Penny Farthing.

As technology developed, so did bicycles. Racing bikes were invented for high-speed cycling on roads. Mountain bikes were invented for cycling off road.

Today electric bicycles are popular. Electric bicycles (also known as e-bikes) have electric motors. All **e-bikes** can be pedalled by the rider, as well as powered by electricity.



Electric Bike

E-bikes use rechargeable **batteries** and the lighter ones can travel up to 20 mph. So if you get tired or are going up a steep hill, you can switch to electric power and have a rest!

Over time, bicycles have become much safer, more comfortable and easier to use.
