


Maths Reading the Time on the Clock to the Nearest 5 Minutes

Twenty five past one



Task 2: Who's read the time correctly?

 <p>It's quarter past four.</p>	 <p>The clock shows the hour hand between 3 and 4, and the minute hand pointing at 3.</p>	 <p>It's twenty past three.</p>
 <p>It's twenty five past nine.</p>	 <p>The clock shows the hour hand between 9 and 10, and the minute hand pointing at 5.</p>	 <p>It's five past nine.</p>
 <p>It's five past seven.</p>	 <p>The clock shows the hour hand between 7 and 8, and the minute hand pointing at 1.</p>	 <p>It's one past seven.</p>

Using adverbs in our instructions can be really helpful to explain how steps should be done.

Here is one of the steps from my instructions on how to thread a needle:



Express Yourself with cooking!



Here is a simple recipe to make pizza at home. You can make a dough for the base or you could use a tortilla wrap or a pitta bread.

What you need:

- Pizza base (or tortilla wrap, pitta bread)
- Pizza sauce (make your own or use ready made or tomato puree)
- Cheese
- Toppings of your choice



Instructions:

1. **First place your tortilla on a pizza tray.** (If you don't have a pizza tray you can use a baking sheet or a large skillet pan. You want to prepare your pizza on the tray so you don't have to transfer the pizza once topped)
2. **Next spread pizza sauce** (or sauce of choice) evenly across the pizza, leaving 1cm at the edge.
3. **Then sprinkle with cheese**
4. **Then add your toppings**
5. **Finally bake** until the cheese is bubbly and golden and the base is crisp (around 10 mins)
